This week's Muskoka Mosaic: Introducing Shane Connon

Shane Connon loves making music. "Being a rock star would be great, but it's a long shot," says the 17-year-old. "My goal is just to be able to play music all the time and live off that."

He's well on his way. For the past two summers, Connon has played several gigs a week at places like the Pub on the Docks and East Side Mario's, most with his father

Connon has experience in larger venues, too: he has appeared in the last four Northern Blues Review events in area theatres and performed with Huntsville High School's Song Project. However, he prefers intimate settings where he can see the audience.

When asked if he gets nervous, Connon replies he did before he spent the summer of 2008 busking all day, every day. "That got the singing and guitar-playing nerves out,"

Born in Brampton, Connon moved at age three to the Dwight area, where he still lives with his parents and younger brother Luke.

Connon grew up watching and hearing his father play various instruments, and when he was in Grade 7 he decided to try his hand at the guitar. Soon he and some friends formed a band, with a repertoire that consisted mainly of classic rock. Connon sang and played guitar. "Not very well, though," he says with a grin. "It was

It couldn't have been too bad, because when Connon and his bandmates were in Grade 8 they were invited to play at a high school Caf Jam. "It was the first time we had performed in public. That was definitely the most nervous I've been," he says.

Near the end of Grade 9, Connon started playing the drums and decided to sign up for the school's music program to learn more. For the next two years he played "tons of drums" in various bands and in 2008 won the Students' Choice Award, which recognizes outstanding effort and dedication to the music program. Connon says he still enjoys drumming with different groups and in a variety of musical styles.

More recently, though, Connon has returned to guitar playing, mainly because it goes along with song-writing. "I always had ideas for songs," he says. "Then one day a couple of years ago I wrote down some lyrics and figured out a melody with the band.'

Now he does the opposite: "I'll be fiddling around with the guitar and come up with something cool. Usually I make up the melody first. I get the verses and chorus worked out and then write the lyrics," says

Connon draws inspiration for his songs from personal experience and from listening to the music of others. "I buy way too much music," he says. "And I'm always working on new songs."

Last spring, he recorded an original song called Take Me Home, which explores feelings of confusion and loneliness. "It's about being lost and looking for something to happen," he says.

Take Me Home has been selected to be part of Moose Trax 5, a compilation recording of talent from northern Ontario. It will also air on Moose FM stations across the province. "That's exciting," says Connon. "When I hear it on the radio that'll be really

When not at work as a labourer for a local electrician, Connon spends most of his time playing music. "I hang out with my friends, too," he says, "but when I got into music, my best friends became people who also played."

Connon graduated from Huntsville High School in June, and he's not sure what the future holds. For the next year, he will work during the day and keep playing gigs while looking into different post-secondary music

One way or another, Connon feels ready to venture out into the world with his

"Huntsville's good place with lots of live music, a good place to grow up, but I'm ready for a change," he says. "We'll see. As long as I'm playing music, I'll be happy. That's all I want to do, really."


